Applicants must have an earned doctorate in communication disorders or a related field and demonstrate a record of or the potential for rigorous independent scholarship and high quality teaching; the CCC is preferred. Responsibilities would include, but are not limited to

- Teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in speech-language pathology
- Developing or continuing a line of basic or applied research in communication disorders
- Publishing in peer-reviewed journals
- Chairing thesis research in the candidate's specialty area
- Providing meaningful university and professional service
