

ASSISTANT/ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK. The Department of Hearing and Speech Sciences (CAA-accredited) invites applicants for a tenure track position at the Assistant or Associate Professor level, beginning August 2011. Qualifications include earned doctorate (Ph.D) in speech-language pathology, speech science, or related area. Expertise in voice/resonance, swallowing, neuromotor, or oral-facial disorders, and/or speech production/physiology is a primary consideration, but other areas of expertise may be considered. Applicants should demonstrate a publication record and have favorable teaching evaluations commensurate with experience. Post-doctoral training and CCC-SLP are preferred. The successful candidate must provide evidence of research productivity, and demonstrate the potential to establish an independent research program capable of attracting external support. Responsibilities include conducting research, teaching undergraduate and graduate courses, mentoring graduate students, and participating in departmental and university activities. Salary is negotiable, depending upon qualifications and experience. The department offers B.A., M.A., Au.D. and Ph.D. degrees and is one of the largest Hearing and Speech Sciences programs in the mid-Atlantic region (web page: [www.hesp.umd.edu](http://www.hesp.umd.edu)). The College Park campus is located in the Baltimore-Washington metropolitan area in close proximity to numerous world-renowned medical institutions and research facilities including the NIH, Walter Reed Army Medical Center/Bethesda Naval Medical Center, Johns Hopkins University, and the University of Maryland School of Medicine.
