



## **Assistant/Associate Professor of Speech Language Pathology**

**POSITION:** Full-time, tenure-track faculty position at the Assistant / Associate Professor level in a research-oriented academic program offering BS, MS, AuD, and PhD degrees. Successful candidate must demonstrate strong undergraduate and graduate level teaching skills, a research agenda, and research productivity commensurate with rank. This is a full-time 8.5-month faculty position with eligibility for tenure and promotion. Compensation is nationally competitive.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Ph.D. in speech-language pathology or related area; CCC desirable. Prefer a candidate with research interests in one or more of the following: neuropathologies / neuroscience of communication and cognition, adult language, communication disorders and aging, motor speech disorders, traumatic brain injury, and stuttering; however, we welcome strong applicants with other specializations.

**PRINCIPAL DUTIES:** Responsibilities will be to establish or continue a line of research and seek external research support, teach undergraduate and graduate courses in appropriate areas, advise student projects, participate in academic advising, and serve on departmental and college committees.
