

# Speech-Language Pathology Clinical Fellow/Resident Opportunities

**The University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB) in Galveston**, a leading academic health sciences center located on the Texas Gulf Coast, offers one-year residency experiences in both audiology and speech pathology. Galveston is located on a barrier island approximately 50 miles south of Houston, the fourth largest city in the United States, and is known for its historic architecture, outdoor activities and unique shopping and dining opportunities.

UTMB's nearly 11,000 employees and medical staff have a well-earned reputation for meeting the health needs of Texas and beyond by educating future healers and scientists, expanding the body of medical knowledge through research, and providing advanced clinical care in a highly collaborative environment. Each of its more than 2,700 students are enrolled in one of four schools: medicine, nursing, health professions, or graduate biomedical sciences.

Residency positions begin in June of each year and provide exposure to a range of diagnostic and treatment services for patients of all ages. During this one-year appointment, the resident fulfills requirements for the ASHA Clinical Fellowship year and the Texas Speech Pathology Intern license. Our dynamic team of five speech-language pathologists provides the following acute care and outpatient services: infant and toddler feeding assessments; pediatric and adult modified barium swallow studies; fiberoptic endoscopic evaluation of swallowing; videostroboscopy and voice treatment; assessment of trach and ventilator-dependent patients; speech rehabilitation for head and neck cancer patients; and speech, language, and cognitive-linguistic assessments.

The selected candidates will possess a minimum of a master's degree in speech-language pathology, eligibility to begin the ASHA clinical fellowship year and Texas Intern license.
