Course Description:

Presentations/discussion of clinical case studies and professional issues in audiology. 1st - , 2nd - and 3rd -year Au.D. students and audiology faculty members will participate in these sessions.

Course Objective:

To provide students with a broad exposure to clinical studies and clinical problem-solving in audiology, aided by interaction with faculty members in a group setting.

Course Format: Clinical case study presentations, primarily by student clinicians. Group discussion/presentations of pertinent professional issues brought forward by students and faculty members.

Students who accomplish these tasks and attend all sessions will receive a grade of S (Satisfactory) for the course. Readings relevant to the clinical study or issued being presented will be assigned by the presenter(s) at least one week prior to the presentation.
